a Director Report: Update on applications, 56 for the Kindergarten lottery. Staffing updates are noted on the report.

- b Education Program Committee: The teachers are starting our 8th cycle of lesson study. The lesson will be taught in math. Staff continues to work on equity. The staff has also been thinking about theme and timelines. The staff also discussed technology and reading. The teachers will also be working to develop a philosophy for technology at PCCS.
- c Finance Committee: Keith provided an overview of the current year budget. He noted the increase in the adjustment of the budget for staffing. There is a current proposal to cap special education funding for charter schools. The board discussed contacting legislators to express concerns regarding this bill. The school safety funds may be used for diversity professional development. The finance committee is starting to discuss the new budget process. There has been a strategic decline in the fund balance over the last few years.

The auction committee is looking for some assistance in contacting some people for donations. Considerations include a match for cash donations for at the auction, classroom baskets.
